a. Awards Feedback

Approximately 122 students received awards totalling \$70,000 (\$40-\$50,000 of which is the Alexander Rutherford Scholarship). Ceremony was well attended – only 7 recipients were unable to come. Many former students were in attendance.

Feeback was shared regarding the need for better communication of honour roll recipients and of the requirements for honour roll. Cupcakes were handed out to HR recipients at school after the awards night but many students and parents aren't aware of their status. The intent is to provide more visual acknowledgement of these students next year. There will be a two-page spread in the Albertan outlining award recipients. Suggestion was made to have the program shared with all parents prior to the ceremony.

ASSESSMENT

- All high school teachers from CESD met at the Alumni Center on Sept 22nd and then proceeded into subject area groupings for the end of the day.
- They are working on creating assessments for the GoogleClassrooms that were created last year. There were 50+ Google Classrooms created last year, and our next step is working on solid assessments to add to those Google Classrooms
- (A note from last year) In the room, if we averaged each teacher with approximately 10 years of experience, there was over 1600 years of experience.
- This work will continue on our other professional learning days throughout the year with assessment the focus of this year, and method of delivery the focus for next year.

4 Seasons of Reconciliation

- An award winning online course created by the First Nations University of Canada, piloted last year by members of CESD
- We will use it to build our knowledge and understanding.
- This professional development course provides the basic foundation on the relationship between Canada and Indigenous Peoples and the Truth and Reconciliation Commission of Canada (TRC), and assists in recognizing and meeting the 94-Calls to Action from the TRC.
- We can use it for our professional development goals, and/or to meet Standard 5 of the TQS, LQS and SQS as teachers and leaders in our schools.

EOHS GOALS (and associated work)

Collaborative Response

- Kurtis Hewson from Jigsaw Learning came in to do an inservice with our whole staff August 31 around Collaborative Response
- Collaborative Response is a system-wide framework that values collaborative, actionfocused responses, data-informed discussions, and timely support to ensure all students can experience success.
- It is part of our CESD and EOHS Educational and Strategic plans to discuss and plan for success of all students. EOHS is formalizing our previous intervention meetings to the more formalized CRM approach.

Attendance Goal continued

2022 - Where it started - interviews with all staff members in June of 2022 highlighted three areas to focus on, reignite or reimagine: attendance, rigor, and culture.

We are still continuing to work on gathering accurate attendance data in efforts to monitor and work on our CESD and EOHS goal pertaining to attendance under the Social Emotional Wellness pillar: Each student will achieve an attendance rate of 90% or higher.

We have tweaked processes for attendance collection in efforts to gather accurate data

(From the CESD website) Make school attendance a priority in your home:

- Communicate the importance of regular school attendance.
- Have regular evening and homework routines.
- Schedule family events and appointments during non-school hours whenever possible.
- Reach out to your child's teacher with any questions or concerns about attendance.

We understand your child will be away at times because of illness and other reasons.Our priority is to eliminate unnecessary absences so that your child can learn, connect and succeed in school!

Questions related to retreats: They are held in the fall as the goal is community culture building; an opportunity for students and teachers to connect.

Question re: Excel. This class was created to address scheduling challenges for Gr. 9 students. Excel combines three former classes: Focus, Digital World and Explorations. Goals are to allow students more exposure to options, ensure opportunities for career exploration, social/emotional and digital citizenship, and all for teaching of executive functioning skills.

Question re: athletics program. There is a jersey shortage. Recognition that the school can't sustain the cost of athletics independently and will need to consider a parent committee. Meaghan R. plans to consult with J. Clattenburg and K. Lorenz re: this possibility.

9a. Trustee's Report

Trustee serves as a bridge between parent council and the school board. Represents 7 schools. The newly hired communications officer is looking at ways to better disseminate information to parents including Facebook, other social media platforms, the school website, etc. Last year's pilot project on mental health support resulted in a doubling of the number of students receiving support. The gov't is listening! Social Studies – changes to K-6 curriculum. ACTION: Please provide feedback on the changes. **ALL**

11. Round Table Discussion
